

Early Years Inclusion Fund, Inclusion Fund or EHCP

What is the inclusion fund and what is the difference between inclusion funding and EHCPs?

Derbyshire Local Authority must make additional funding available.

SEND Code of Practice - Paragraph 5.59

Local Authorities must ensure that all providers delivering funded early education places meet the needs of children with SEN and disabled children. In order to do this local authorities should make sure funding arrangements for early education reflect the need to provide suitable support for these children

SEND code of Practice – Paragraph 6.99

...the authority where the child or young person lives, should provide additional top-up funding where the cost of the special educational provision required to meet the needs of an individual pupil exceeds the nationally prescribed threshold.

In Derbyshire inclusion funding can be applied for by early year settings and schools either through the **Early Years SEN Inclusion Fund** or **the Inclusion Fund**. This does not affect the legal rights of parents to request an **Education Health Care Needs Assessment (EHCNA)** if they think their child's needs should be met through an **Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)** or the duties of the local authority to conduct this assessment.

Additional funding is decided by an inclusion panel.

The panels are there to look at requests from Derbyshire early year settings or Derbyshire schools to access additional funding to support the inclusion of children and young people with additional needs. The panels may also signpost settings to other services who could offer additional advice and support.

EHCP: A legal plan to put in place support and funding for children and young people aged 0-25 who have SEN to 'provide the best possible outcomes across education, health and social care' across a range of educational provision including maintained, non- maintained, some independent schools, and colleges.
